### SECTION 4: First-aid measures

#### 4.1 Description of first-aid measures

**General notes**

#### 5.2 Special hazards arising from the substance or mixture

In case of insufficient ventilation and/or in use, may form flammable/explosive vapor-air mixture. Solvent vapors are heavier than air and may spread along floors.
